



Language Placement @ DU

- **No Test-Out Option:** All students must take a college-level language course, even bilingual speakers, due to DU's Proficiency + requirement.
- Placement Test: Students continuing a language they started before DU must take a <u>language placement test</u> to determine their starting level.
- Exempt Programs: The Bachelor of Fine Arts (BFA) and all Engineering degree programs are exempt from the language requirement.

Math Advising Tool

- •Usage: All incoming students should use the Math Advising Tool to determine the required math course based on their major and transferred courses.
- •Proficiency Survey: Depending on survey answers, students may take a math proficiency survey to assess readiness for MATH 1200 (Calculus for Business and Social Science) and/or MATH 1951 (Calculus I).
- •No Pass/Fail: The survey is not a placement test; it helps recommend the appropriate math course.
- •Non-Science Major Option: MATH 1150 (Foundations Seminar) is offered in Winter and Spring.



ELECTIVES

Electives are courses that count toward your minimum credits for graduation and are not already counting toward other parts of your degree, such as Common Curriculum, major, or minor.



Closed Course Error

- Once registration begins and classes begin to reach capacity, students should look for other options. We recommend having 3-5 course plans. Be flexible!
- STEM or Pre-Health majors that are required to take a specific course listed on their course plan that is closed reach out to advising@du.edu immediately.



Repeat Course

- If a student wants to retake a course for which they have received credit, have them email the Registrar's Office for an override:
 - <u>registrar@du.edu</u> or 303-871-4095
- Waitlist (unavailable until Tuesday, July 30th)
 - Waitlisted is **NOT** registered
 - Don't rely on waitlisted courses, get a full schedule of registered classes

Co-requisite Error (Linked Section)

- Student registered for a course but failed to register for its accompanying lab or lecture. This error happens predominantly with science courses.
- With linked lectures and labs, both Course Registration Numbers (CRNs) must be selected and submitted in the same registration transaction.


