



What's in the Canvas course?


- Information, resources, and transitional support information <u>prior</u> to their arrival in the fall
- Upcoming action items that includes how, where, and when tasks need to be completed
- Federally mandated trainings that must be completed before they arrive on campus
- Practice using Canvas, the web management system used for all their academic courses

What happens if my student doesn't complete the modules?

- They will not be prepared once on campus
 - Includes important harm reduction trainings to build a strong and safe DU Community
- Winter quarter registration hold will be placed in October and lifted
 24 hours after completing required modules

When do these modules need to be completed?


- All modules need to be completed by Tuesday, September 2nd
- General recommendation, one module per month
 - Modules will open at the beginning of May, June, July, and August
 - Modules align with current action items and are most effective when completed during the month they're released

Important Privacy Info: FERPA

- » Family Educational Rights & Privacy Act (FERPA) of 1974
 - » Provides students with rights regarding their educational records
 - » Students can release all or part of these records to third parties such as parents
 - » Complete "Release of Confidential Student Record Information" in their My4D portal
 - » DU will not release student records without the student's written consent
 - » Review the <u>Welcome Webinar</u> to learn more about FERPA











Roles

- » Financial Aid
 Office
 - » Process aid applications
 - » Award scholarships, grants, loans, workstudy
 - » Send aid offer letters
 - » Advise and counsel students

- »The Office of Student Billing
 - » Student billing
 - » Payment plans
 - » Pioneer ID cards

- »Office of Student Employment
 - » Manage job board and hiring
 - » Professional development for student employees and supervisors
 - » HR support for employee relations





Work-Study and Student Employment

Work-Study


- Need-based award as part of your financial aid package
- Federally and state funded
- Not a grant or a loan
- Not from the department budget
- Paid bi-weekly through payroll
- Still need to get a job and work the hours to get the money!





Work-Study Eligibility

- Students must file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) every year to determine eligibility. Not guaranteed year-toyear.
- Program is open to both undergrad and grad students. Awards range from \$2000 to \$5000 depending on class level.
- Students must be **enrolled at least ½ time** to receive work-study (6 credits for undergrads)
- One work-study funded job at a time (can have a work-study and a non-benefited position at the same time).





Work-Study Timeline

- Can work through school breaks, not on holidays or when campus is closed.
 You must be registered for the upcoming term.
- No working using work study funds after you graduate
- Work-study funding cannot be used for part of the summer.
- Starts: July 14, 2025
- Ends: June 11, 2026 for most students





More About Student Employment

- »Most jobs are 10-15 hours per week and pay is determined by the qualifications
 - » Minimum wage is \$18.81/hr
- »All campus jobs are posted on PCO
- »All campus positions require background check, W-4 (tax withholdings), and I-9 (bring original documents to campus)
- »Student Employment Job Fair
- »Professional Development and HR Support

Loans and Scholarships



Financial Aid Eligibility

- » Enroll fulltime (12 or more hours) for most aid to credit
- » Maintain satisfactory academic progress (SAP)
 - » 2.0 cumulative GPA (2.5 for accounting majors)
 - » Complete & pass a minimum of 66.6% of all courses attempted
- » Gift, endowed, and private scholarships may have additional requirements.



Student Loans

- »Federal Subsidized & Unsubsidized Direct Loans offered to those who qualify
- » Valid FAFSA required
- »Up to \$5,500 for first year students (freshmen)
- »Disburse directly to student account
- » Master promissory note & entrance counseling required » <u>www.studentaid.gov</u>
- »Interest rate for 2025-26 year is to be 6.39% for undergraduate Direct Subsidized and Unsubsidized loans



Parent PLUS Loans

- » Federal loan available to eligible parents of undergraduate students
- » Student must submit FAFSA
- » Repayment begins 60 days after disbursement but can be postponed until student graduates
- » May borrow up to full cost of attendance minus any other aid
- »Apply at studentaid.gov
 - » Requires credit check (must not have adverse credit history)
- » Interest rate for 2025-26 is 8.94% Direct Plus loans




Private Loans

- » Utilize private banks for funding instead of the federal government
- » FAFSA not required
- » Credit-based
- » Terms & interest rates vary depending on the lender
 - » Generally, less favorable than federal loans
- » Repayment may be postponed

Private Scholarships

- » Many search engines for researching
 » Scholarships.com, fastweb.com
- »Never pay to apply for a scholarship
- »May require adjustment to aid
 - » Financial need & cost of attendance limits
- »Submit scholarship checks to financial aid office







Special Circumstances









Special Circumstances

» If you/your family experience an unexpected change to your financial situation, this may qualify your student for a special circumstance appeal

» Examples

- » Loss of employment or reduction in wages
- » Divorce or separation of parents
- » Loss of child support
- » Loss of one-time income
- » Unusually high medical or dental expenses
- » Email finaid@du.edu





Student Billing, Payments, & Refunds









Tuition Statements

- »Posted to DUPay on the 1st of each month & payment is due on the 22nd of each month
- »Include all activity for prior month & are "point in time"
- » View real-time data via Account Activity in DUPay



DUPay

- » Students access DUPay via MyDU
- » Parents access DUPay via Student Billing webpage
 - » Make a Payment quick link
- » Students can set up multiple authorized users
 - » Authorized users have separate passwords
- » Students & authorized users emailed when a new bill is posted
- » Can store payment methods





DUPay – Authorized Users

- » Students
 - » Log into DUPay
 - » Select Authorized Users tab
 - » Enter email address for authorized user
- » Authorized Users
 - » Receive 2 separate emails
 - » One with username
 - » One with temporary password
 - » Must change password during initial login



DUPay

- » Students can revoke access for any authorized user
- » Authorized users manage their own passwords and account preferences
- » Authorized user stored accounts are not visible to student or other authorized users
- » Multiple authorized users can be granted access
- » Authorized users can be granted access to view:
 - » Statements
 - » Account activity & history
 - » 1098T tax forms





Financial Aid Disbursements

- » Financial aid pays directly to the student's account 10 days prior to the start of each term
- » Excess financial aid is refunded to the student
 - » Parent PLUS Loan refunds can be sent to parent or student



Payment Plans

- » Sign up on DUPay
- » Payment always due on the 15th of the month
- » \$50 enrollment fee per quarter
- » Fall quarter
 - » August, September October
 - » 2 payment plan September & October
- » Winter quarter
 - » December, January, February
- » Spring quarter
 - » March, April, May





Payments

- » Electronic Payments using DUPay
 - » Fastest & most accurate method
 - » ACH/Electronic check (must use a personal checking/savings)- no fee
 - » Credit card payments 3% non-refundable fee
 - » Wire transfers
- » Accepted at Cashier's Office
 - » Cash
 - » Personal, trust, money market, 529 check
 - » Money order
 - » Cashier's check
- » Options available on the Student Billing website (www.du.edu/student-billing)






