



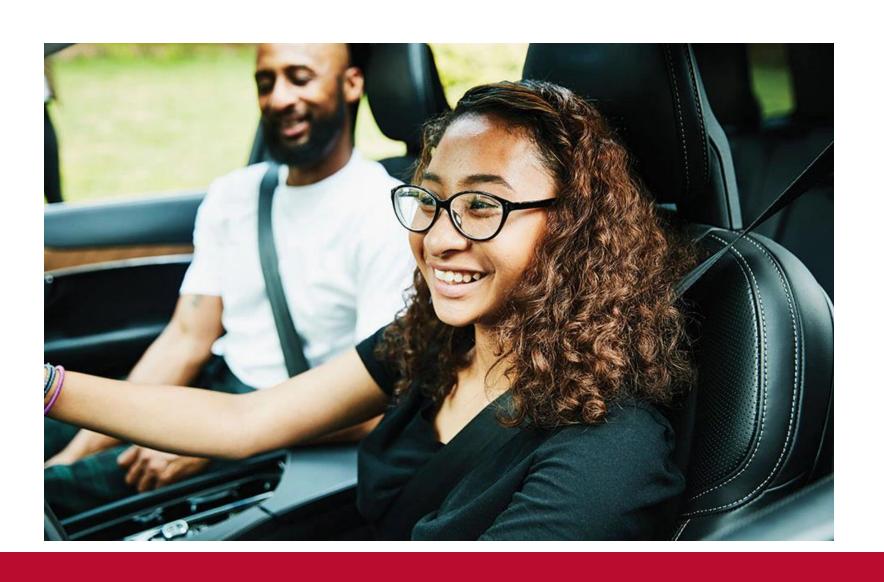


Office Overview

Where will my student learn all this information?

Discoveries Online Experience on Canvas:

What's in the Canvas course?

- Information, resources, and transitional support information <u>prior</u> to their arrival in the fall
- Upcoming action items that includes how, where, and when tasks need to be completed
- Federally mandated trainings that must be completed before they arrive on campus
- Practice using Canvas, the web management system used for all their academic courses

What happens if my student doesn't complete the modules?

- They will not be prepared once on campus
 - Includes important harm reduction trainings to build a strong and safe DU Community
- Winter quarter registration hold will be placed in October and lifted
 24 hours after completing required modules
 - Module 3 holds required trainings from Vector, we predict this module will take 6-8 hours to complete

When do these modules need to be completed?

- All modules need to be completed by Tuesday, September 2nd
- General recommendation, one module per month
 - Modules will open at the beginning of May, June, July, and August
 - Modules align with current action items and are most effective when completed during the month they're released

In the face of these difficulties, how can family members support one another to enhance student and family thriving? During this presentation, new families will learn about research that addresses this question, as well as the DU 4D Experience. They also will take away strategies for communicating, establishing rituals, creating schedules and rhythms, and establishing roles that facilitate new student and family well-being.	
3pm	Navigating the Transition: When to (Not) be Concerned	It's normal to worry about your student during this large transition, but it can be difficult to know when and how to check in on your student's well-being. In this session, DU's Thrive Health Promotion Team will help you understand which behaviors are "typical" for college students, and which may warrant some concern. Half of this session will focus on conversations around mental health, including what levels of stress and struggle are common, how to navigate potential changes to your relationship, and when to seek higher levels of support. The other half will discuss how alcohol and other substance use can impact personal and academic well-being and how you can support your student's safety through a harm reduction approach.

- 4D Peer Mentors will work with individual students to meet accommodation needs






Conversations to Consider this Month:


- Have you thought through your schedule and what you need to be healthy? (Sleep, food, activities, etc.)

- How can we celebrate the big move before we leave for campus?


