

Discoveries Online Experience on Canvas:

What's in the Canvas course?


- Information, resources, and transitional support information <u>prior</u> to their arrival in the fall
- Upcoming action items that includes how, where, and when tasks need to be completed
- Federally mandated trainings that must be completed before they arrive on campus
- Practice using Canvas, the web management system used for all their academic courses

What happens if my student doesn't complete the modules?

- They will not be prepared once on campus
 - Includes important harm reduction trainings to build a strong and safe DU Community
- Winter quarter registration hold will be placed in October and lifted
 24 hours after completing required modules
 - Module 3 holds required trainings from Vector, we predict this module will take 6-8 hours to complete

When do these modules need to be completed?


- All modules need to be completed by Tuesday, September 2nd
- General recommendation, one module per month
 - Modules will open at the beginning of May, June, July, and August
 - Modules align with current action items and are most effective when completed during the month they're released




Our Purpose:

- Contribute to a sense of belonging on campus


Sense of belonging is a significant factor in student retention, as it is positively associated with institutional commitment and intentions to persist

 Students who are involved in campus clubs, organizations, and committees tend to have a greater sense of belonging in college than their peers who are not involved in clubs or are involved less frequently

Register for Family Orientation!

Families need to register for event BEFORE gaining access to Discoveries App!

Step 1: Register for Family Orientation on a Computer

- Does not work well on phone or tablet browser
- Use the "First Time User" box to create an account
- If it's not working, try a different browser or call our office (303-871-6080)

Step 2: Download Crimson Connect App

- To login, use the email tied to the Family Orientation registration
- System will send you 6-digit code as password
- If it's not working, reach out to our office or view the app with your student on their account
