

Daniels Advising Webinar Themes (July 7, 2026)

What classes should I take for Autumn Quarter 2026?

1. **FSEM 1111** First-Year Seminar (4 credits): This is required for all first-year students and is not required for transfer students.
2. **Choose one** of these options (take one in year 1 and the other in year 2):
 - a. Start either your **Language sequence** (depends on [Language placement](#) results, if continuing study vs. starting a new Language in 1001 – 4 credits)
 - b. Start your **Scientific Inquiry: Natural & Physical World sequence** (lab science – 4 credits for lecture, 0 credits for lab)
3. **MATH 1200** Calculus for Business and Social Sciences (4 credits for lecture, 0 credits for lab) or MATH 1951 Calculus I (4 credits)
4. **Choose one of these options** for the last 4 credits (the classes you don't take in Autumn Quarter can be completed in Winter or Spring Quarter):
 - a. **BUS 1440** The Fourth Industrial Revolution (4 credits)
 - b. **INFO 1010** Analytics I (4 credits), with **INFO 1011** Excel lab (0 credits)
 - c. **ECON 1030** Intro to Micro and Macroeconomics (4 credits)
 - d. If pursuing a major in **Hospitality Management**, check with Lauren Sepúlveda (Lauren.Sepulveda@du.edu) about taking **HOSP 1100** Exploring the Hospitality Industry (2 credits) in either fall or spring of year 1.
 - e. If pursuing a major in **Real Estate and the Built Environment**, take **REAL 1700** Fundamentals of Real Estate and the Built Environment (4 credits) in year 1 or 2.

Is there a “wrong” first Business class to take in Autumn Quarter? Every graduating student has taken a unique pathway through their courses at DU! Please know that you have a lot of flexibility to select which Business class you take in Autumn Quarter. Advisors will be reviewing students' registration after July 20-24, and if any adjustments are needed, you will receive a message via your [DU email address](#).

What if my preferred Language course is full when I register? You have a few options:

Option 1: If you're flexible about your Language options, choose another Language instead.

Option 2: Register for your Scientific Inquiry: Natural & Physical World course for Autumn Quarter 2026 instead for now, to make sure you have a class that still supports progress toward graduation, and plan to take your Language sequence in year 2. You also can periodically check the online schedule of classes after July 24, since students are adjusting their registration in real time and a spot may become available.

How can I receive additional support to build sample schedules and register?

How are time tickets assigned for registration? For this first time registering, new transfer students and students in some groups (Honors students, student-athletes, ROTC students, and students with [approved early registration accommodations](#)) will register on Monday, July 20. Times are randomly assigned throughout the rest of the week (July 21-24). For future terms, registration times are assigned based on the number of credit hours that a student has earned.

If I register right at my registration time, do I have a better chance to get my preferred classes? Registering at your registration time increases the chances that you will get your preferred classes; however, there are lots of excellent course options available that still support your progress toward on-time graduation even if you do not get your specifically preferred sections of a class! Try different sections of your preferred classes, like your other 4-5 top choices for FSEM 1111, or other sections/meeting times for classes like BUS 1440 The Fourth Industrial Revolution.

What if I can't register right when my registration time ticket starts? If you aren't able to register right when registration starts for you, you will still be able to get 16 credits that support progress toward graduation.
