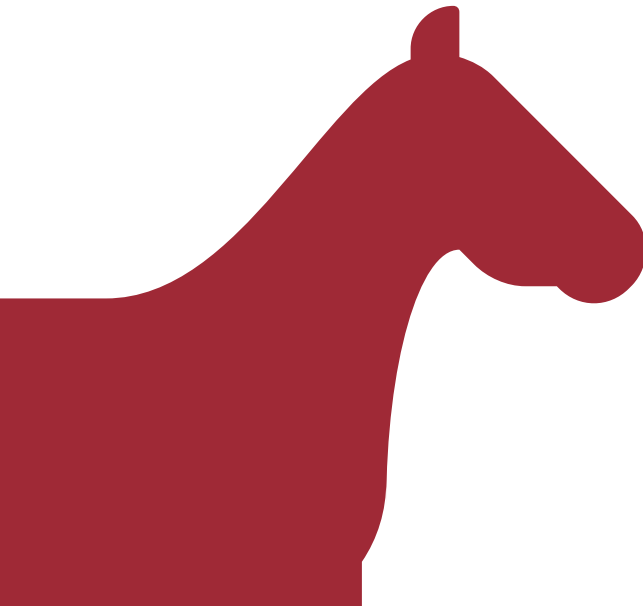

When do I register?

1. Log into the [My4D](#) dashboard
2. In the **search bar** at the top of the dashboard, type “**Register for Classes**”
3. Click “**Prepare for Registration**” to view holds and find your time ticket.

	3	MATH 1200 Calculus for Business and Social Sciences (4 credits for lecture + 0 credits for lab) or MATH 1951 Calculus I	
	4	Something Business-related: • BUS 1440 The Fourth Industrial Revolution (4 credits) • INFO 1010 Data Analytics I (4 credits) + INFO 1011 Microsoft Excel Certification Lab (0 credits) • ECON 1030 Intro to Micro and Macroeconomics (4 credits) • And more!	

Course #1: FSEM 1111 First-Year Seminar

- **All first-time first-year students** (not transfer students) must register for a 4-credit FSEM during fall quarter.
 - Your Orientation group!
 - First course in the Common Curriculum
 - Introduces students to academic values and norms in the DU community
 - Faculty teaching on a subject of personal interest to them
 - ***Not major-specific***
 - **Pick 3-5 options**, with a variety of meeting times/days, in case your top choice is full
 - **Course descriptions available on the FSEM website**

Course #2: Start your Language or Sl: Natural sequence

Complete one in year 1 and the other in year 2

Language

Up to 12 credits

- Total credits required are based on placement
- AP/IB credit does not apply but likely results in a higher placement

Sl: Natural

12 credits

- Lab science coursework (non-Science major options exist)
- AP/IB credits can apply to reduce total credits required

Language sequence (4-12 credits, based on placement)

Sl: Natural sequence (12 total credits across one year)

Non-Science major options:

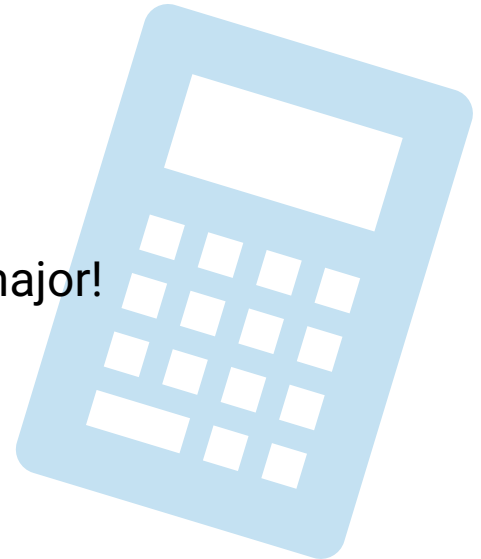
- BIOL 1260-1262 Sustaining Life I-III
- CHEM 1001-1003 The Science of Contemporary Issues I-III
- COMP 1111-1113 Electronics for the Arts 1-3
- GEOG 1216-1218 Our Dynamic Earth I-III
- GEOG 1264-1266 Global Environmental Change (Honors only)
- PHYS 1011-1013 21st-Century Physics and Astronomy I-III

Options for specific groups:

- **AP/IB credit?**
 - Confirm scores required for Scientific Inquiry: Natural & Physical World requirements in the [DU Bulletin](#).
 - Check with an advisor about your remaining requirements.
- **Pre-Health?** Take CHEM 1010 & 1240 General Chemistry I in fall.
- **Optional minor in a Science field?** Consult the [DU Bulletin](#) or check with an advisor on specific course options for your intended optional minor.

Course #3: Calculus requirement

- [Math Advising Document](#)
- Business majors are required to earn a **C- or better** in one Calculus class (either MATH 1200 Calculus for Business & Social Sciences or MATH 1951 Calculus I)
 - Most business majors take MATH 1200
- **Resources:**
 - Faculty or TA office hours (listed in syllabus)
 - [Math Center](#)
- **Transfer, [AP, or IB credit](#)** for MATH 1951 Calculus I?
 - You've fulfilled the Math requirement as a Business major!





Course #4: Something Business-related

Required for all Business majors throughout year 1*

*Some flexibility is possible

BUS 1440 The Fourth Industrial Revolution

- Complete in fall, winter, or spring of year 1 (recommended fall)

INFO 1010 & 1011 Data Analytics I with Excel lab

- Complete in fall, winter, or spring of year 1 (possible in year 2, if needed)
- 0-credit Excel lab supports **Microsoft Office Specialist (MOS) certification requirements**

ECON 1030 Intro to Micro and Macroeconomics

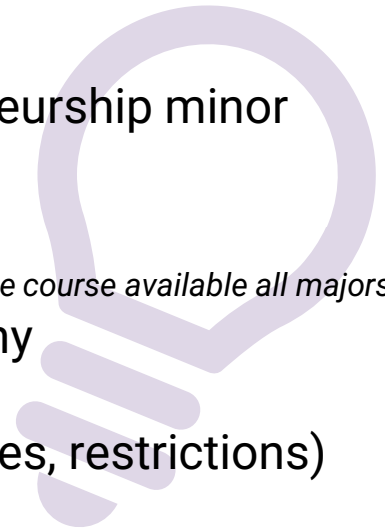
- Fulfills half of the **SI: Society** requirements in Common Curriculum

Hospitality Management or Real Estate major options

- **HOSP 1100** Exploring Hospitality Management (2 credits): Complete in fall or spring of year 1
- **REAL 1700** Fundamentals of Real Estate and the Built Environment (4 credits): Complete in year 1 or 2

Other considerations

- **WRIT 1022:** Check your DU email for a message from advising@du.edu on June 15, 2026, if you need to take this course or [request an exemption](#)
- Only **12 credits**?
- Waiting on **AP, IB, transfer credits, or dual enrollment/concurrent enrollment credits**? Don't repeat classes you've already taken.
- **General Electives** are GREAT in year 1!
 - EVM 1100 Intro to Entrepreneurship, for the Entrepreneurship minor
 - EVM 1400 Intro to Franchising
 - BUS 3350 Overview of Outdoor Recreation Industry
 - BUS 3700 Topics in Business: Money Drills (*personal finance course available all majors*)
 - INTS 1500 Contemporary Issues in the Global Economy
 - INTS 1700 Intro to International Politics
 - Any course of interest (check prerequisites, corequisites, restrictions)
