Move-In Time Slot

We are an urban campus, there's not enough space for everyone to move in at the same time!

To help with that:

- Students will select a time to move in for Tuesday, September 1st between **Thursday, August 6th - Monday, August 24th**.
 - Students must sign up for a move-in time!
- Timeslot selection instructions will be included in the Move-In/Timeslot Notice email to be supplied on Tuesday, August 4th.



Early Arrival - Sponsored Programs

Student Parking Permits

- **Parking On Campus:**

- Residential students are allowed to bring their cars and park on campus
- All student parking permit sales for the 2026 – 2027 academic year will begin on **Monday, August 3rd, at 9:00am.**
 - Commuter student parking permits are live
 - All lots are first come first serve basis
 - Preferred lot sold out? Join the waitlist
 - You may purchase another permit while you are on the waitlist to ensure you have a place to park.

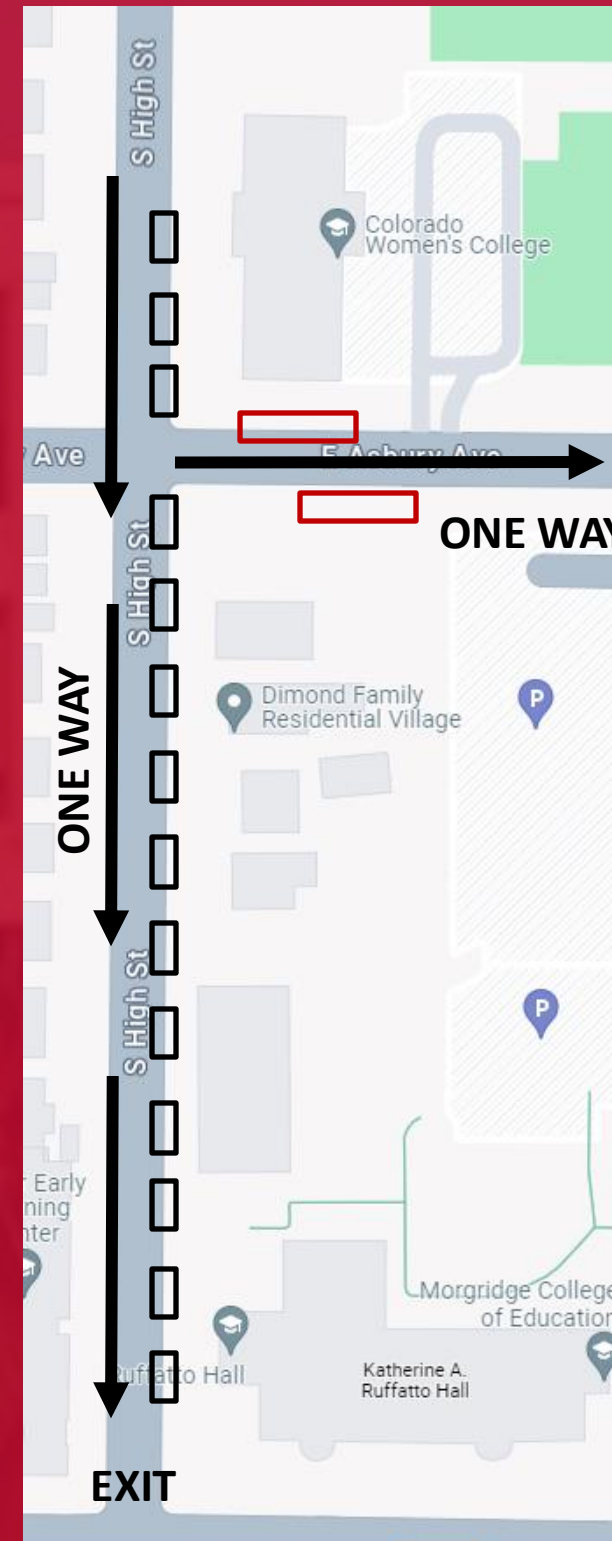
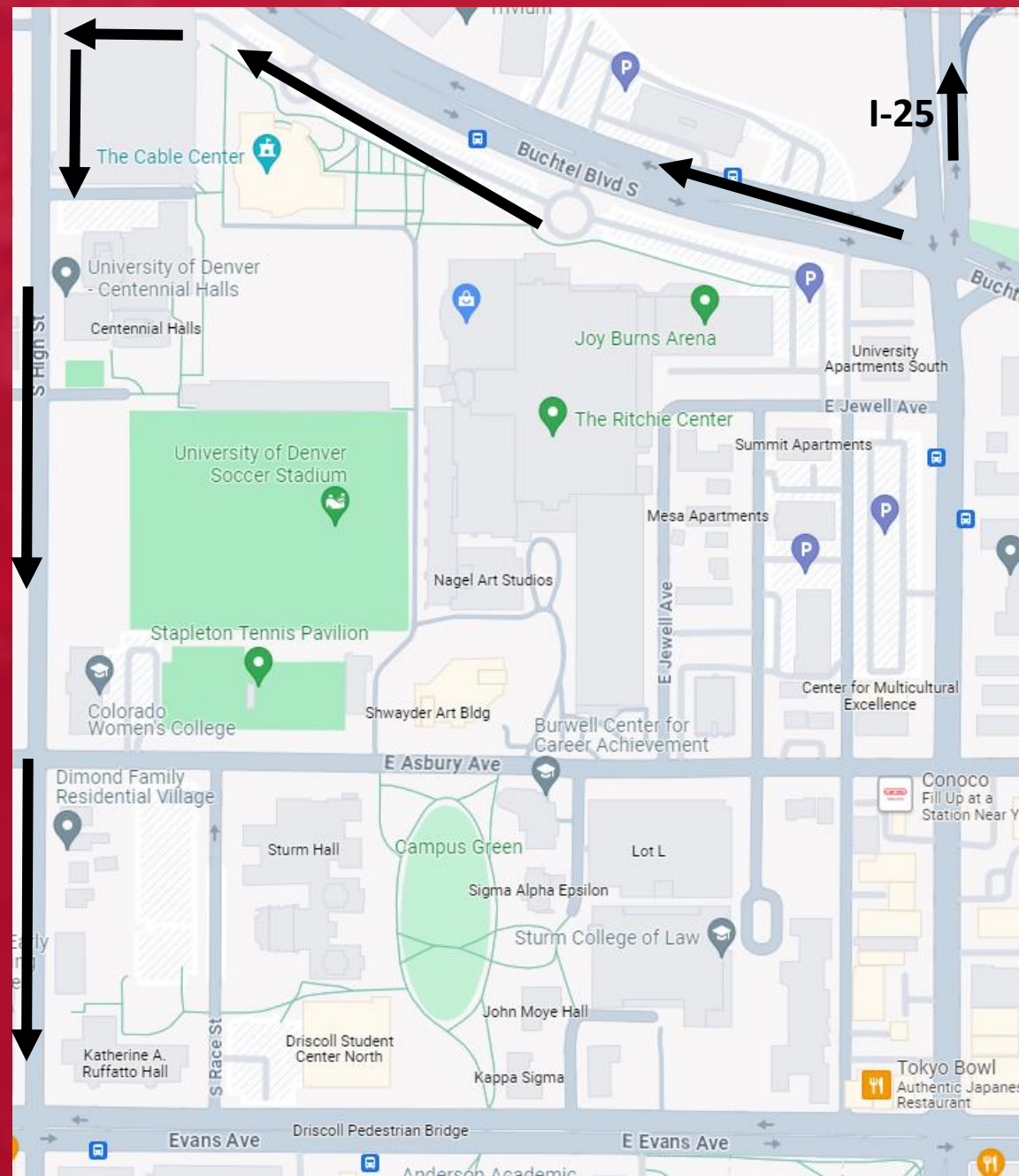

- For students moving into Dimond Family Residential Village Pods A, B, or C, you will utilize **Lot 103**, initially, for check-in. Please arrive via I-25 at University Blvd. (Exit 205). After taking the exit, drive down Buchtel Blvd. and enter at the Cable Center Entrance (2240 Buchtel Blvd. S., Denver, CO 80210). Continue to follow the traffic lane through Lot 103. You will proceed straight onto S. High St, to unload on the street near DFRV. Overflow temporary unloading will be directed to Lot T. After unloading, move your vehicle to long-term parking in **Lots W and 108**, entered from Buchtel Boulevard. Every 15 minutes, a shuttle from Lot 108 will carry passengers to the main campus.

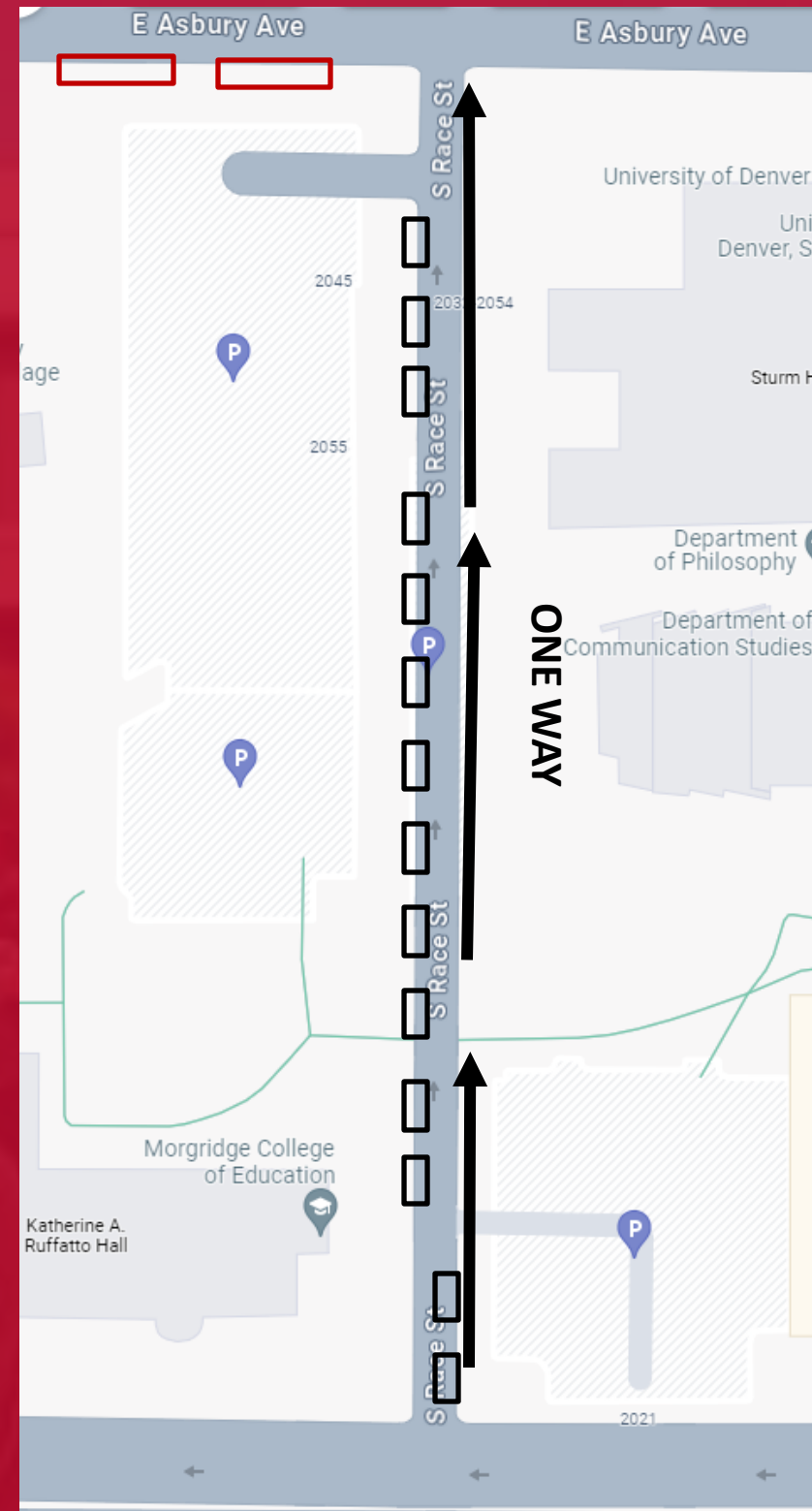
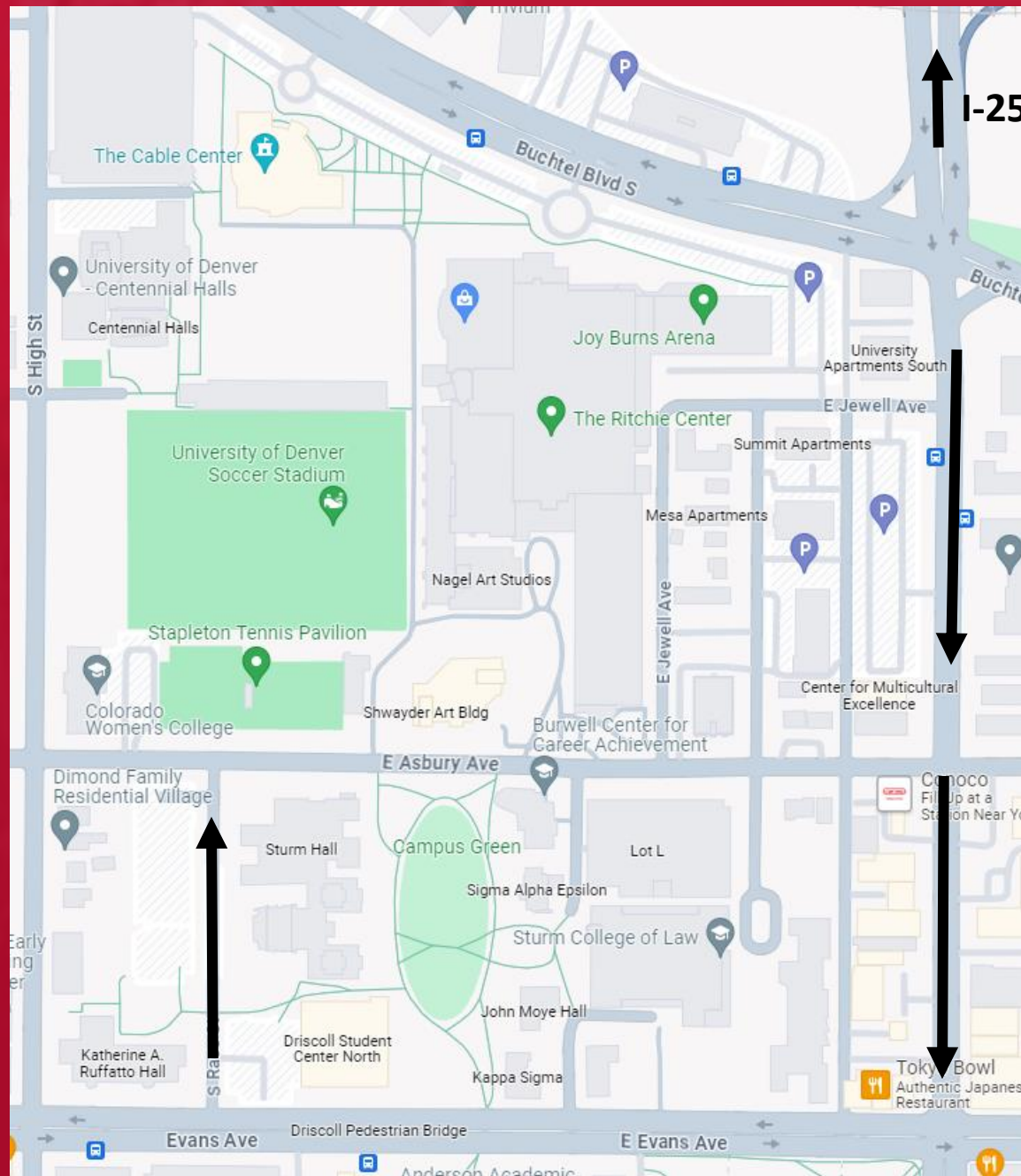

After taking the exit, drive south on University Blvd. and turn right onto Evans Avenue. Proceed to 2055 E. Evans Ave., Denver, CO 80210, and make a right onto S. Race St. to unload. After unloading, move your vehicle to long-term parking in **Lots W and 108**, entered from Buchtel Boulevard. Every 15 minutes, a shuttle from Lot 108 will carry passengers to the main campus.

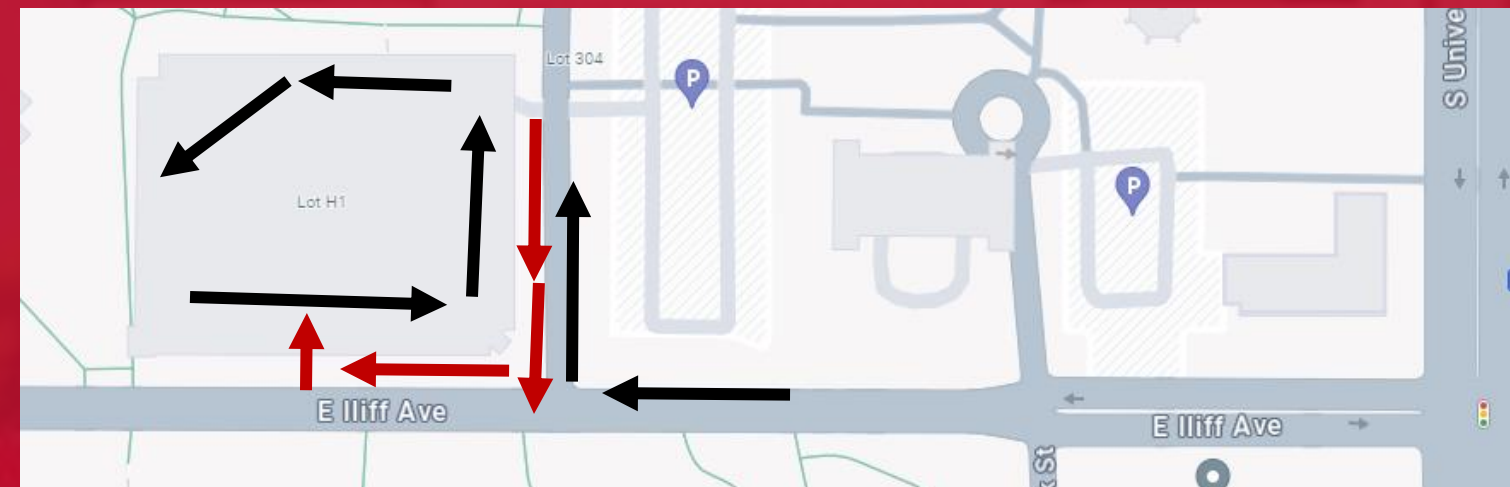
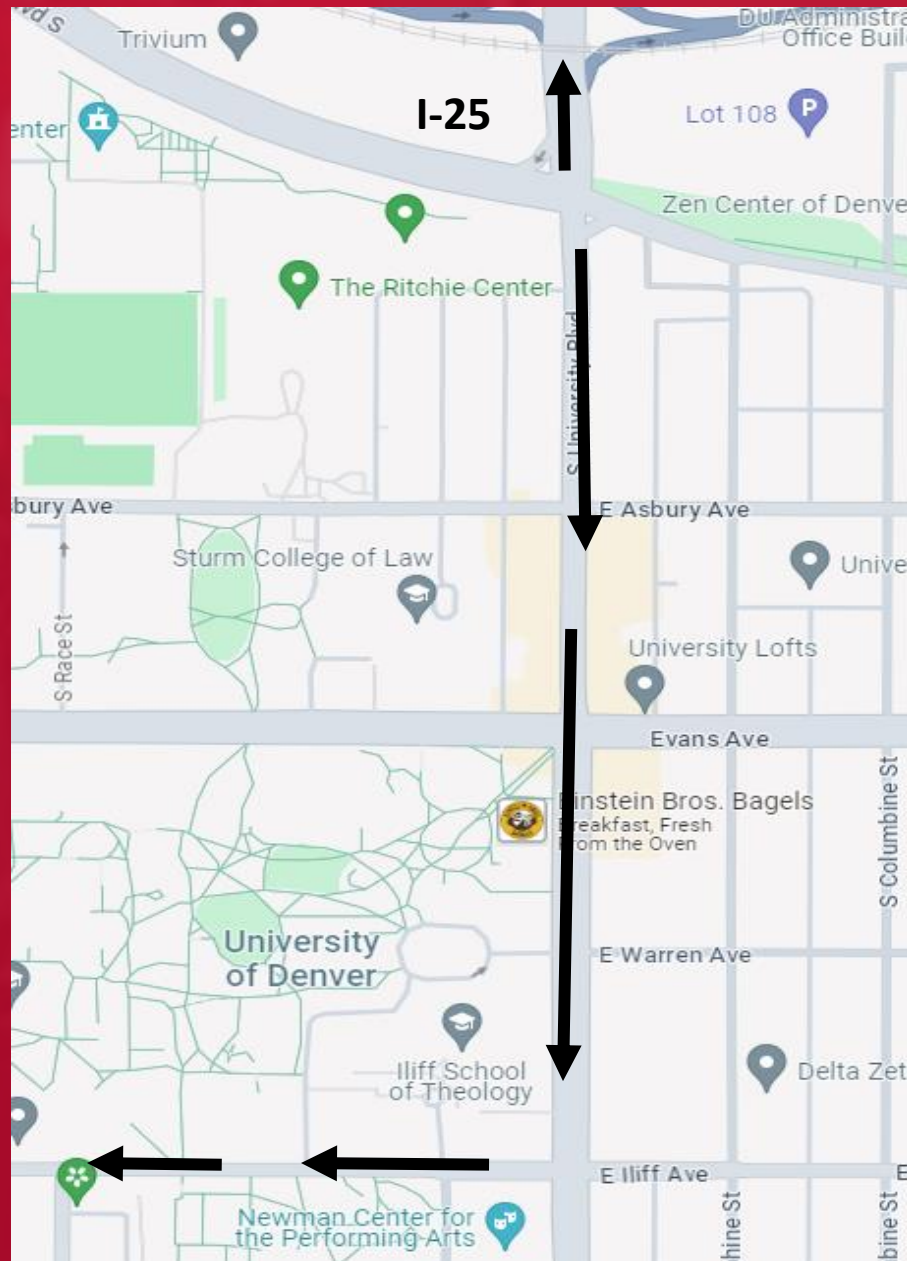

Enter the upper deck to receive your temporary parking permit. The upper deck is allocated to overflow temporary unloading. Exit the upper deck and head to the lower deck, which is the designated temporary unloading zone.

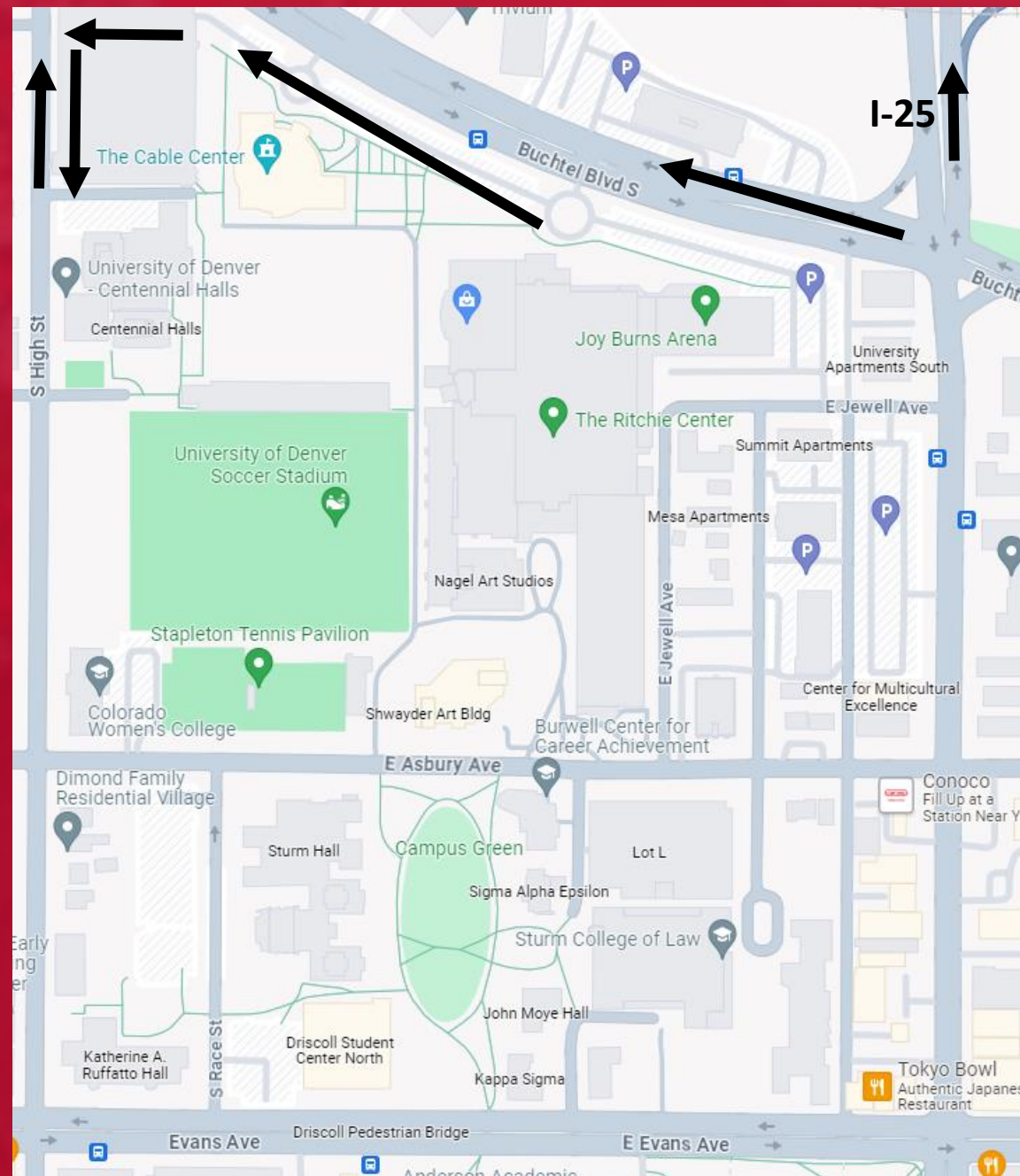

After taking the exit, head south on University Blvd and turn right onto E. Iliff Avenue. Lot H1 will be on the right-hand side of the street. After unloading, please move your vehicle to long term parking in Lots N1, N2, and P. Every 15 minutes, a shuttle from Lot P will carry passengers to the main campus.

You will proceed straight onto S. High St, taking a right. You will proceed to Lot C, which is the temporary unloading location. Check-In will be facilitated in Lot C. After unloading, move your vehicle to long-term parking in **Lots W and 108**, entered from Buchtel Boulevard. Every 15 minutes, a shuttle from Lot 108 will carry passengers to the main campus.

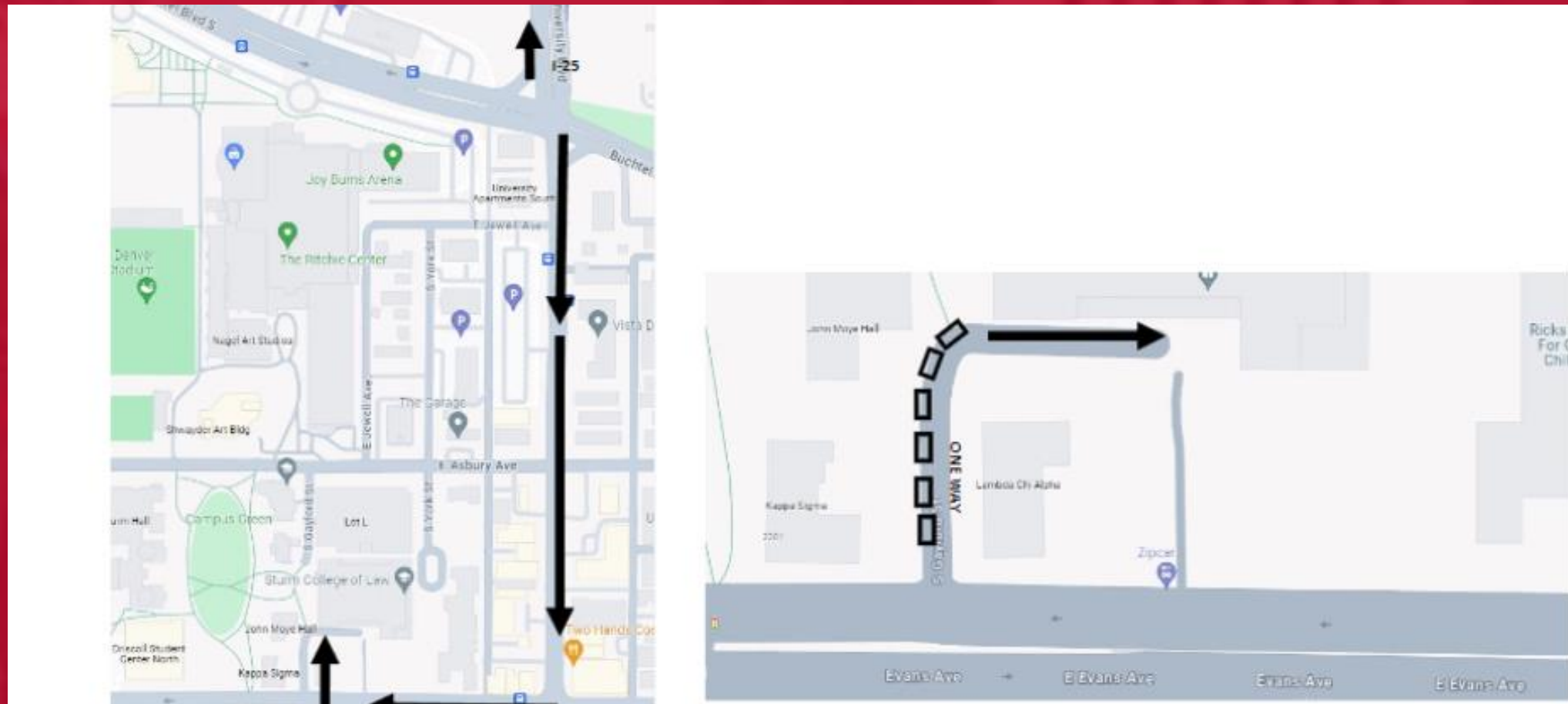

- **Golf Cart Shuttle**

- Two Shuttle Systems – Tuesday, September 1st

- **DFRV**

- Two 6-Passenger Golf Carts
 - Connection between DFRV and Lot 108
 - Drop off every 10-15 minutes
 - TLC guests would utilize this shuttle.

- **JMAC**

- Two 6-Passenger Golf Carts
 - Connection between JMAC and Lot P
 - Drop off every 10-15 minutes

- The Shuttle Service Concludes at **3:00pm**. **If your vehicle is in Lot 108/P, we recommend relocating your vehicle to Lots N1, N2, W, within the interior of campus, prior to this time.**
 - **Lots N1, N2, and W will serve as Extended Parking Solutions from 3:00-10:00pm.**

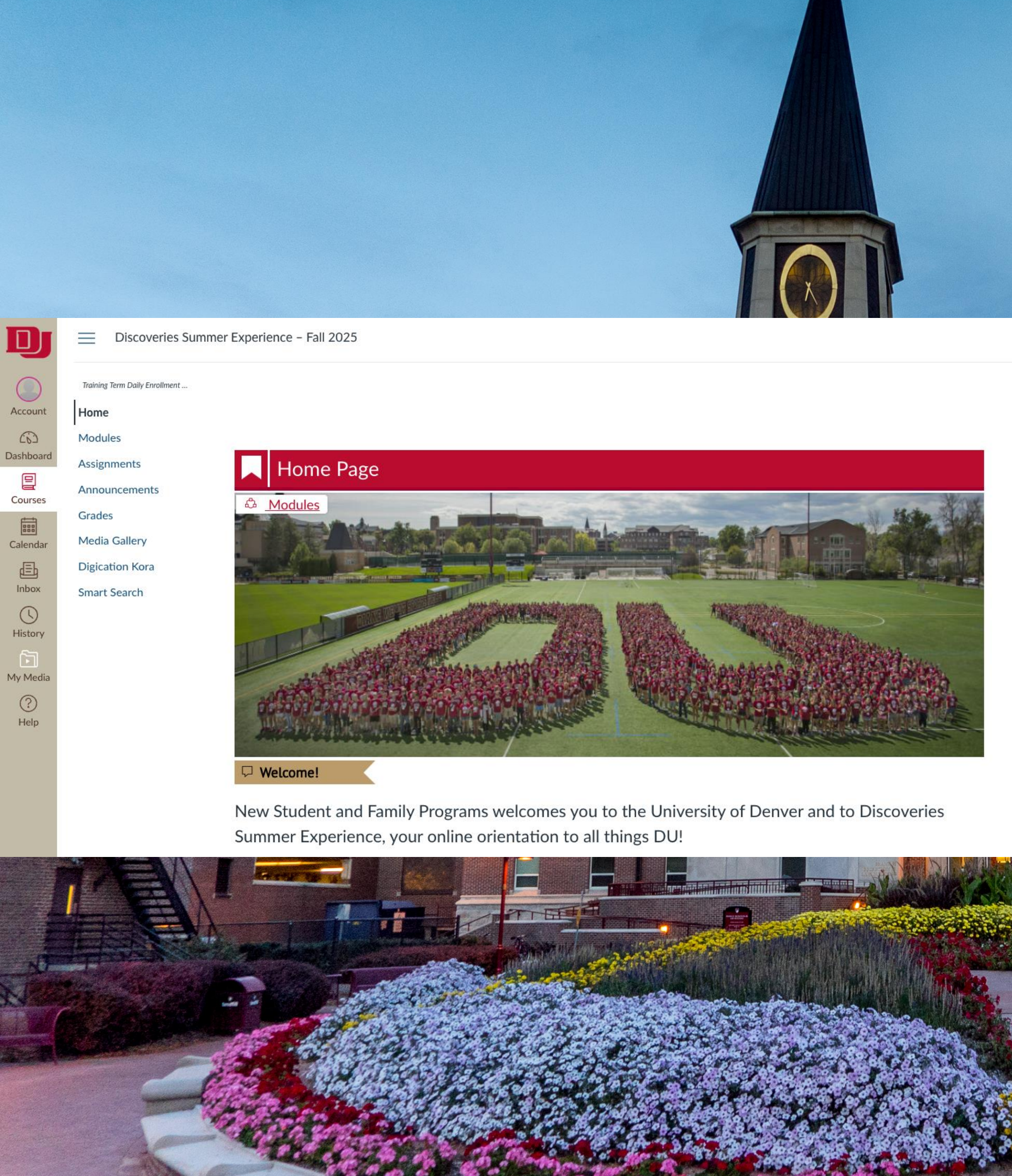

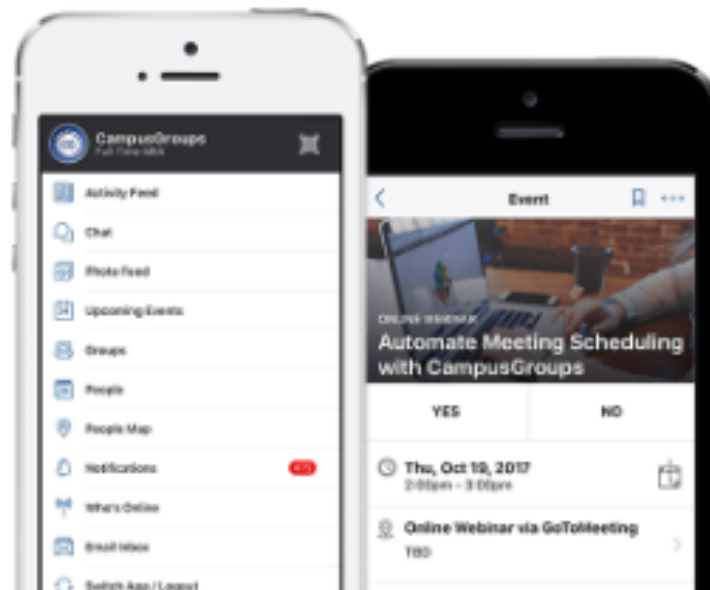

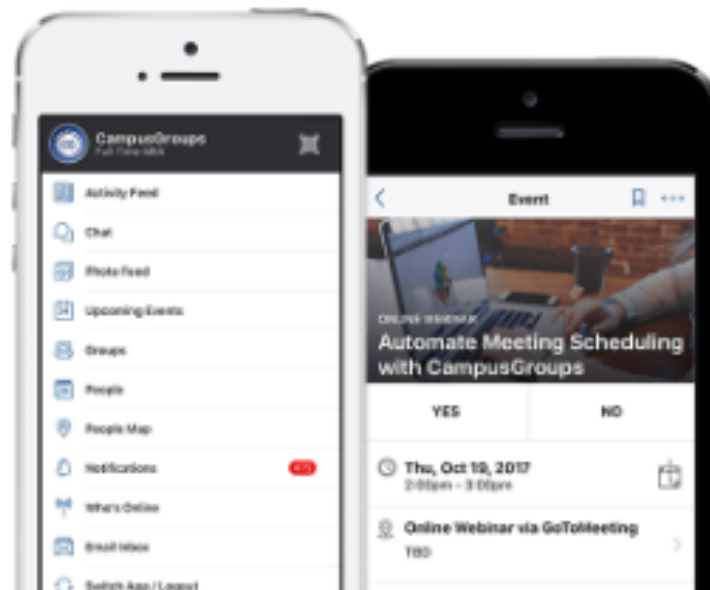

What if my student needs accommodations?



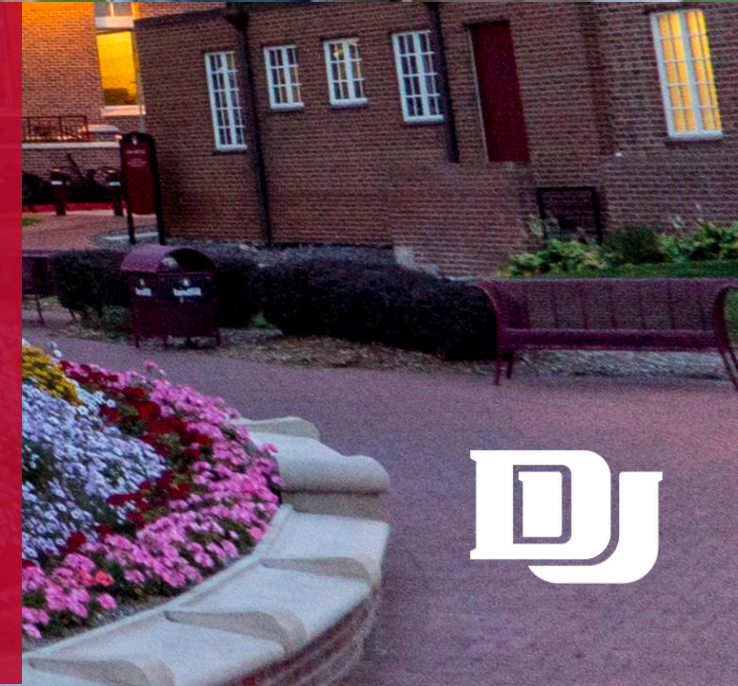
- Partner with Student Disability Services and have your student email orientation@du.edu

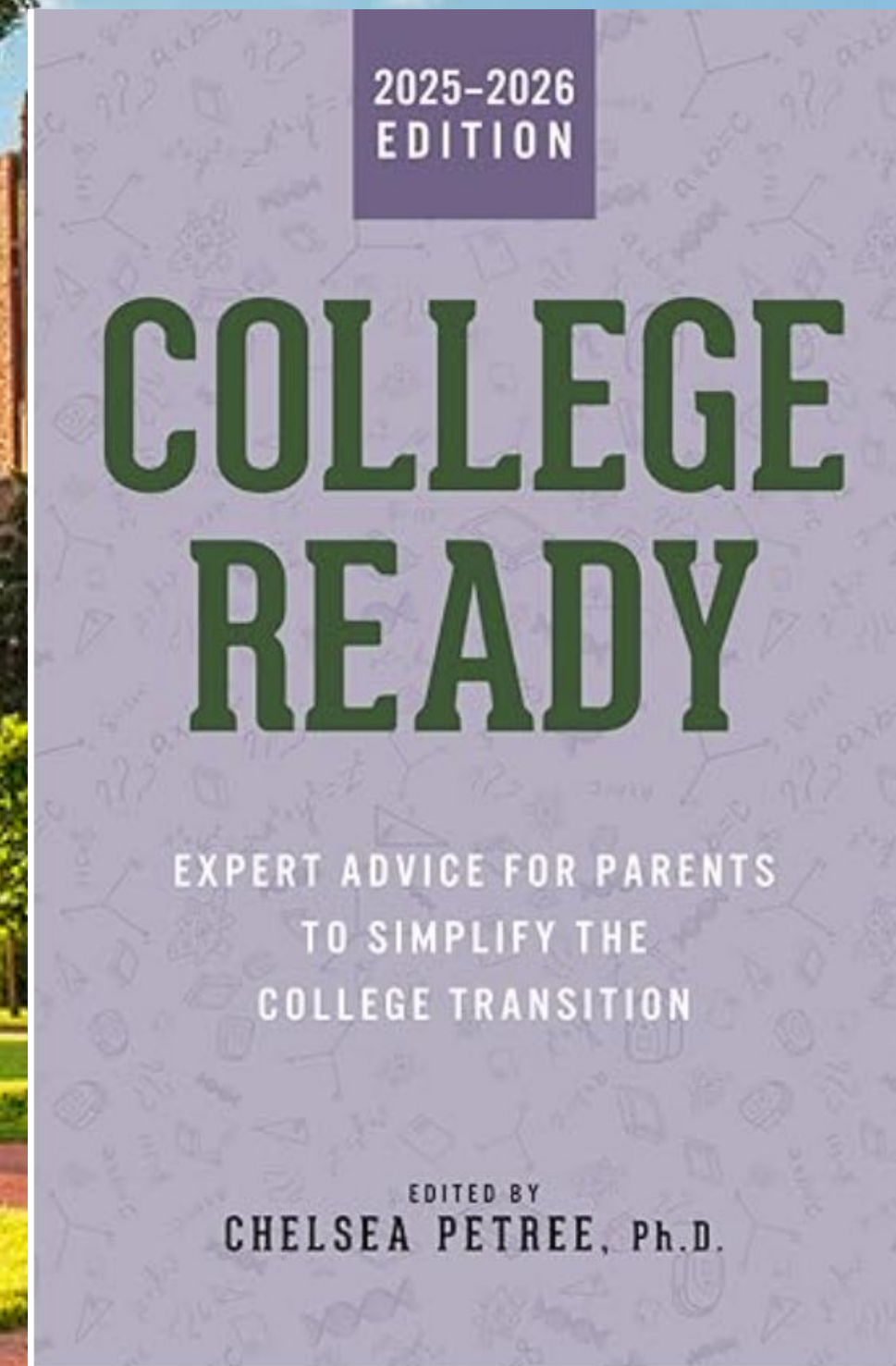
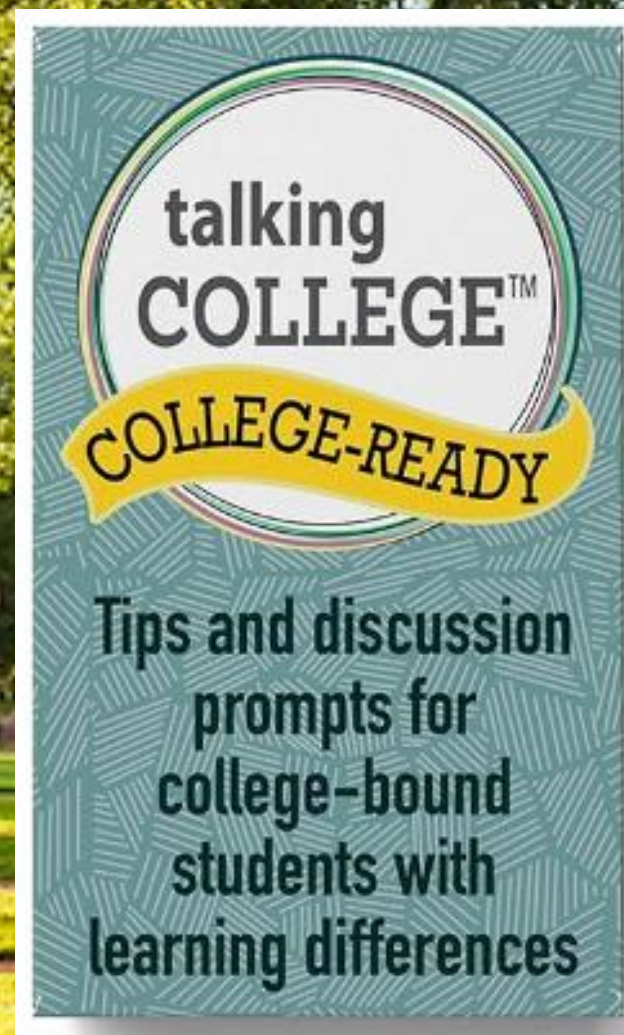
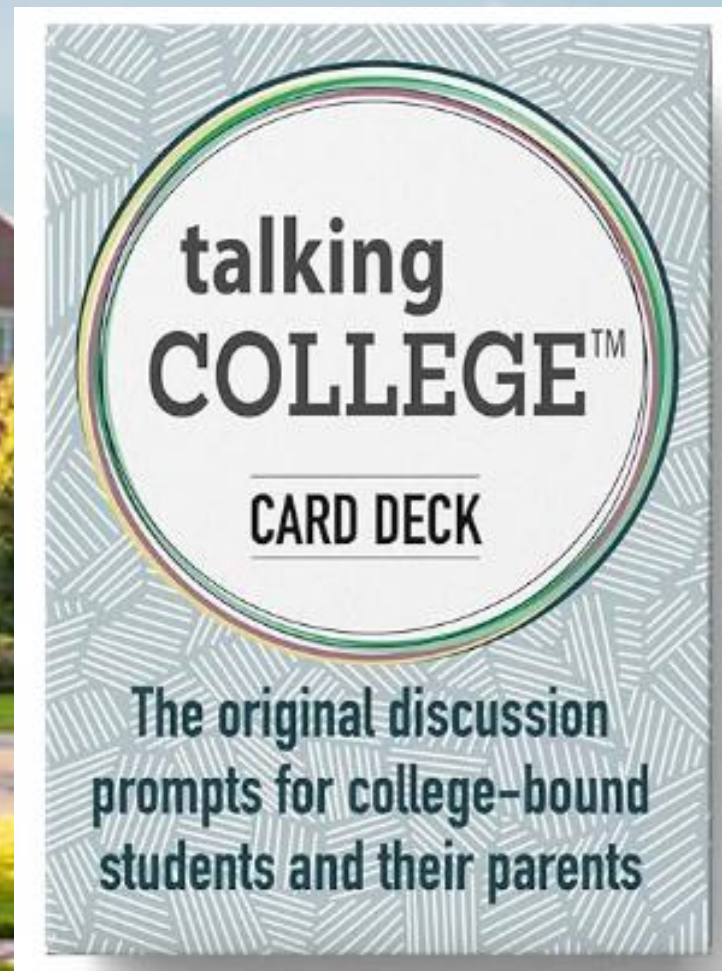
